Year 5&6 Basketball Competition

On Thursday 26th January we held our year 5&6 Basketball Competition at Upton-by-Chester High School. Sixteen school teams took part in the event involving 126 children. A staggering 56 games were played on the two courts with the winners and runners up on each court progressing to the semi-finals.

Christleton and Upton Heath primary schools took part in the first semi final in a close game, but with Christleton scoring a basket to get through to the final.

Saughall and Waverton played in the second semi-final with Waverton scoring one more basket to beat Saughall into the final.

The grand final which was
Christleton verses Waverton
turned out to be a marathon of a
game. After a draw at the end of
the playing time, it then went
down to a very tense golden goal.
An exhaustingly 34 minutes later
Christleton scored the winning

basket!. The teams played extremely well considering they had already played 8 matches in the competition.

Two players from Cheshire Phoenix basketball team came along to the event and provided some discounted tickets to Cheshire Phoenix games. These were then handed out to 8 children who were



selected for good sportsmanship, enthusiasm and talent in the competition.

A huge thank you to Upton-by-Chester High School for hosting the event and also to the leaders from the school who were excellent basketball referees. Thank you also to coaches from CEPD who helped at the event.

The players from Christleton Primary School will now play in the Level 3 School Games final in March.

Year 5&6 Sportshall Athletics

On Wednesday 1st and Thursday 2nd February Ellesmere Port Sports Village hosted the Year 5&6 Sportshall Athletics Competition. In total 18 school teams took part in the three events, involving over 350 children.

The winning school from each event were as follows:

On Wednesday 25th January children from Dee Banks and Dorin Park School attended the Step into Sport Conference at Orford Park in Warrington.

Here the children participated in a workshop where they learned about the skills and qualities of a leader / role model.

They also took part in a rowing practical where they were taught about communication skills and how to deliver an engaging activity or competition.

In the second practical workshop they

learned about the STEP principle in leading sports activities.





Paralympic swimmer Liz Johnson was in attendance on the day to assist with the delivery of the workshops and to inspire the children. Liz has won a gold, silver and bronze Paralympic medal for swimming at the Athens, Beijing and London.

Also helping at the event was wheelchair basketball player Ben Field Davies who attends a local school and is a great inspiration and role model.

Thank you to the staff from Dee Banks and Dorin Park Schools for bringing the children to the event.

The children have been tasked with developing the skills they learned in the workshops, and to support sporting activities within their own schools or level 2/3 competitions.

Following the training session the children have been tasked with developing and moving forward the Change 4 Life Club in their school.





School Games Mark 2016-2017

The School Games Mark is now in it's 6th year and continues to reward schools for their commitment to and development of competition, school sport and physical education.

New for this year is a Platinum award. This is open to those schools that have achieved School Games Mark gold for the past four consecutive years and achieve gold this year too.

In order to achieve any level of the School Games Mark, schools must meet a set of prerequisites (for young people in years 3-13). They must have:

- A system in place to track young people's participation in the School Games
- Opportunities that attract the less active young people to participate in physical activity
- Completed the Inclusive Health Check
- A positive approach to delivering physical activity
- Held or accessed a School Games Day as a culmination of a year round competition programme
- Registered a School Games Day date on the school dashboard www.yourschoolgames.com
- A calendar of competition that demonstrates opportunities for young people with SEND to take part in competitions.
- A notice board and / or a in-house school digital system that promotes School Games activity and
 uses social media for the same purpose.

If your school can achieve the set of pre-requisites above, then you can then look at the Bronze, Silver and Gold criteria. Most schools should be able to achieve at least the Bronze level.

Any school can apply for the award if you embrace the mission and vision of the School Games.

The application window is live between Wednesday 31st May and Friday 28th July 2017. (Please note that this is the first year that applications have to be submitted before the end of the academic year).

Please use the next few months to fully prepare for your application and ensure that your school sport provision meets the level of criteria that you are aiming for. As in previous years your school could be chosen for external verification and you will need to be able to provide evidence for all the pre-requisites and criteria for your award.

Progress and Assessment for Learning within Primary Physical Education.

The need for excellent teaching in PE, particularly related to the fundamental movement skills, which are the foundations required to enable all children to succeed in PE and Sport.

The performance criteria of the fundamental movement skills. (Locomotion, Object control and Stability)

How to observe children moving, what to look for using the performance criteria and help the children to improve their fundamental movement skills.

Review the PE milestones which are linked to the PE National Curriculum and the performance criteria and use these as an assessment aid.
